

Call for RID Test Sites

Hosting a RID Test Site and administering exams involves a commitment of time and facilities; however, it is also a valuable service to the interpreting community and can be a very rewarding experience. Here are some frequently asked questions:

Q: What RID Exams will I have to administer?

A: The Knowledge (Written) and Performance Exams for SC:L, CDI, and OTC.

Q: Is there a requirement on how many exam appointments I have to offer?

A: A Test Site should be able to offer a minimum of 50 exam appointments per year. Less than one per week.

Q: How much can I earn for administering RID exams?

A: Test Administrators are compensated between \$25-\$35, per exam, depending on the examination.

Q: What materials are required to administer RID exams?

A: A private warm-up room, private testing room, 27" TV Monitor, DVD player with remote control, VHS player with remote control, computer with a DVD player, and recording device/video camera.

Q: Can I administer an exam if I want to take that exam myself?

A: No, Test Administrators must already be certified and/or have no future plans to take RID certification exams.

Keep in mind, every RID Test Site must have a Site Coordinator who serves as the main representative for that site. Site Coordinators are responsible for security of exam materials and scheduling exam appointments for eligible candidates. The Site Coordinator may choose to act as a Test Administrator and oversee the exam process or enlist a separate RID approved Test Administrator.
