- I. Numerous communications with Board and Committee members for Treasurer and organization business, including:
 - a. Sharing Membership and CMP records of payment (PayPal, Wild Apricot, and Wells Fargo) with each committee NOTE CHANGE: PDC no longer wants email verifying a record of payment sent.
- II. Quickbooks is our new accounting system beginning January 1, 2017. We *may* slowly work our way backwards to put data into the system; but our public records satisfy our financial accountability; and, therefore, is not mandatory.
- III. Refund request due to special circumstances to be presented to the Board for approval to be discussed in the executive session.
- IV. Treasurer's laptop backup system (Carbonite) has been suspended. After consulting a professional IT, the advice was to go with Carbonite as they are the best that is "out there". Their advice was to have a dual layer of security by also downloading to the cloud or to an external hard drive, depending on the amount of information needing storage. Then I contacted Carbonite and their representative gave me the following breakdown:

Business (Office) Non-Profit - \$242.99 p/ year (\$269.99 normally). This backs up 1 computer and external hard drive.

Personal (no discount) - \$59.99 p/ year for 1 computer \$99.99 p/ year for 1 computer with hard drive

I think the \$59.99 per year is really all we need. I don't think an external hard drive is necessary as the information we need to store is not extensive.
