Loyalty Card update: We are very grateful for the feedback from leadership. The comments were extremely helpful, so far leadership seem to agree and move forward with the following:

- 1 workshop = “1 punch or credit”
- Only SCRID PDC workshops will be available for a “punch” or “credit”
- 4 “punches” or “credits” will qualify for a free workshop.
- Redeemable “free” workshop does not technically expire. We will need to look into WA and if this is a possibility
- The free credit will equate to \$25 cash, so if a workshop price exceeds this amount, the attendee is expected to pay the difference.

Many Interpreters ask what the benefit of being a SCRID member is, we feel this loyalty program can and will encourage non-members to become members.

The following aspects are still undecided and PDC would like some feedback:

- WA can handle the loyalty program?
- True Punch cards: policy if lost?
- Can interpreters “gift” their free workshop to a friend?
